Cavaliers of the Northeast 08/22/15, Sturbridge, MA

Judge: Rachel Venier (Orchard Hill)

I was delighted to receive the invitation to judge the CNE's August 22, 2015 Championship Show in Sturbridge, Massachusetts. My thanks to the club for taking care of me through the weekend, to the competitors who exhibited their dogs with professionalism and grace, and to the stewards, particularly ring steward Liz Colbert, who kept the day running smoothly. There is nothing I enjoy more than studying dogs, and I was spoiled with a large entry, a big indoor ring, good lighting, and the elusive neutral-color hotel carpet. I was happy for our breed to see the depth of quality, particularly in the puppy, Bred-By Exhibitor, and Open classes. Throughout the day, I was looking for a moderate dog with gentle Cavalier expression, in balance with himself and of one piece both standing and moving. I was happy with the type and proportion on most exhibits, and very happy with my winners today. They are a credit to their breeders and owners.

Junior Puppy Dog (3)

- 1. Kalidunn Sambuca at Mileslip (Skidmore) Eight month old black and tan boy with pretty headpiece, correct proportions and large dark eye, ample cushioning. Cobby body with good bone, and straight silky coat texture. Carried his tail off his back and moved with drive. 2. Chadwick Bronze Prince (Eckersley) Really good quality seven-month-old blenheim puppy dog. Handsome headpiece, expression not quite as soft at this age as the puppy in front of him. Great layback of shoulder, balanced front and rear with hard topline and good tailset. He moved with reach and drive. 3. Tassajara Stoli (Seidman/Hughes/Berkau) Pretty head on this seven-month-old blenheim boy. Short coupled with straight silky coat texture. He seems to just be getting his legs underneath him in the ring. Senior Puppy Dog (4)
- **1. Forestcreek Heart of Rock N Roll** (Painter/Cline) I really liked this eleven-month-old blenheim puppy dog. He is all of a piece, in balance with ideal proportion (slightly longer than tall and equal distance shoulder to elbow, elbow to ground), stands four square, well angulated front and rear, and holds a strong level topline both standing and on the move. He has a lovely head with big dark eyes frontally placed, well cushioned beneath. Outstanding pigment and color and a great little showman. **Best Puppy Dog**
- 2. Dreamvale Follow All My Moves (Perini/Sage/Colbert) Ten-month-old typey blenheim puppy. Very handsome headpiece, large dark frontally placed eye, well-cushioned beneath, abundant coat, well-angulated front and rear, and hocks well let down. Another very nice puppy in this class. 2. Kellene The Blacklist (Carter) Ruby boy, almost eleven-months old. Very pretty head with good proportion, short coupled with sufficient leg underneath him. Good topline, coat quality, and pigment. 4. Hiddencreek One Shot of Patron (Weinstein/Green) This was a nice puppy who was all moderation: head, bone, and proportion. My notes say he is a good quality puppy who shows promise and just needs to gain ring confidence.

Graduate Puppy Dog (7)

- 1. Miletree Perseus At Shirmont (Henry) I was immediately taken with this young dog for his moderate proportion and soft expression which are the hallmarks of our breed. Lovely headpiece with correct proportions, slight stop, and moderate cushioning. With his large round frontally placed eyes and ears set high but not close, he had the distinctive gentle Cavalier expression. Good pigment, long well arched neck leading into well laid shoulders, hard level topline, rear angulation matching his front, hocks well let down, tail correctly set and carried off his back. He was true coming and going and moved with reach and very good drive. I thought this was a very nice young dog with breed type, correct breed proportion, and toy sporting spaniel soundness. It was a pleasure to have him in the ring. Reserve Winners Dog
- 2. Piccadil For Your Eyes Only (York) I thought this was another good quality dog. Handsome, masculine headpiece with large dark frontally-placed eyes, well-cushioned underneath. Ribs well sprung, balanced front and rear, short coupled, hocks well let down, and hard topline. Balanced movement. Presented in impeccable physical condition, well muscled, and a good showman. 3. Foxwyn Cool Water (Norton/Baker-Fox) Beautiful headpiece on this young blenheim man. Large dark frontally placed eyes, soft expression. Good proportion of body. Dark pigment and color. Straight silky coat. I liked his size. He was less physically mature than the two boys in front of him. 4. Ca Cambridge Rutledge (Magera/Mitchell) Black and tan boy with very pretty head, frontally placed eyes, cobby body, good pigment and coat quality.

Novice Dog (5)

1. Nordic Hills Persuasion (Cerulli) Very nice ruby dog. Moderate head with large round eyes. Good proportion, outline, level topline, lovely neck that led into well-laid shoulders. Rear angulation matched front. Moved with reach and drive and tail off his back. This dog just needs "finish." **2. Kellene Resurrection** (Carter/Ezzo) Small black and

tan dog. Cobby shape, balanced front and rear, showing with abundant Cavalier attitude. **3. Avia Make it Work** (Poti) Blenheim dog with large round eyes, moderate head, correct proportion and good reach and drive on side gait. He just needs ring experience. **4. Crystalkane Dream Maker** (Alexander) Larger blenheim dog with handsome head, round eyes. well-cushioned headpiece. Good topline and balanced side gait.

Bred By Exhibitor Dog (4)

1. Ch Hiddencreek Hugo Boss, JW (Green) Blenheim dog with good type. This dog caught my eye across the ring because of his overall shape and balance. Large dark eyes frontally placed, well cushioned beneath, and a soft expression. Level topline and tail carried off his back, creating a pleasing side gait. The picture was finished with abundant straight silky rich red coat. He was beautifully prepared and presented and never let down showing. Best Bred by Exhibitor Dog 2. Shirmont Caddo Balliol, JW (Henry/Dodson) Moderate-size cobby blenheim dog, short coupled with good bone. This dog was very well angulated, strong topline, hocks well let down, good tail set and carriage. True coming and going, good reach and strong drive. His head was handsome but a bit heavier than the first dog. Exuberant boy, at times a touch charmingly naughty. 3. Clarmarian Classic By Design (Young-May) Another moderate size blenheim dog, beautifully prepared and presented. Handsome head with correct proportion of skull and slight cushioning under eyes. Slightly longer than tall, correct proportion shoulder to elbow, elbow to ground, and short coupled. Dark pigment, silky straight coat. 4. Castlemaine Harry Potter (Warme) Well balanced and well proportioned dog. Handsome head, large eyes, which could have been a bit darker, well cushioned beneath. Level topline and balanced side gait.

Junior American Bred Dog (1)

1. Infinidad Lil Runaway (Laliberte) Ruby boy, eighteen months old. Pretty head with very big round eyes, slight cushioning beneath. Elegant young dog with particularly good arch of neck. Balanced movement. Rich red ruby color, dark pigment and straight silky coat texture. Exuberant, happy young man!

American Bred Dog (8)

1. Mimric Moves Like Jagger, JW (Painter/Hodges) Good quality blenheim boy. I liked him for his shape, balance, and overall soundness. Handsome head, well cushioned, shallow stop, large dark eyes. Correct body proportion, good spring of rib, short coupled, good bone. Dark pigment, silky straight coat. Presented in beautiful condition. Exhibited true Cavalier character and never let down showing. 2. Foxwyn Avant (Meath) Another quality blenheim dog of similar type to #1. Masculine, handsome headpiece, lovely eyes and pleasing expression. Very good front end with good depth of chest, good arch of neck leading to well-laid shoulders. Strong topline and a rear that matched his front. He had a fluid side gait, moving with reach and drive, holding his balance and topline, and carrying his tail right off his back. 3. Briarcrest Burberry, C-RN, RN, CD (Katz) Blenheim dog with a classic Cavalier headpiece, with no exaggeration and the softest expression. This was a glamourous dog with abundant coat, and he was well presented. He was slightly larger than the two in front of him, but of correct proportion (both slightly longer than tall, equal proportion shoulder to elbow and elbow to ground). He did not move out quite as freely as the two in front of him today. Nevertheless, I thought this was a lovely typey dog. 4. Dreamvale Ollivander (Sage/Hallsted) This was the most charming blenheim dog who never stopped smiling and wagging through this large American Bred dog class. Handsome head with big dark eyes, well cushioned beneath, giving him a soft expression. Created a lovely picture on the move--true coming and going, with reach and drive on side gait. Slightly longer cast than those in front of him.

Health & Conformation Dog (1)

1. Dancasa Cute as a Button, JW (Tiedemann) Smaller five year old blenheim dog with pretty head and sweet expression. I liked that he was a cobby, short coupled dog. Good proportion, with sufficient leg under the dog, balanced standing and on the move, carrying his tail off his back. It was a pleasure to watch this dog still enjoying his job in the Health and Conformation class.

Special Limit Blenheim Dog (2)

1. Piccadil When You're A Jet (York) This was a typey blenheim boy. I liked him most for his compact shape and size while retaining correct proportion, with sufficient leg under the dog, good bone and substance, and Cavalier cushioning. Big dark round eyes with slight cushioning beneath and the sweetest, melting expression. Good spring of rib, balanced, well muscled through his thigh, and hocks well let down. Lovely straight silky coat. 2. Clopsville Meridian (Rychlik) This was another really lovely dog. Beautiful headpiece. Good arch of neck leading to well-laid shoulders. His rear matched his front allowing him to move with reach and drive, his tail off his back.

Special Limit Tricolor Dog (5)

1. Piccadil Dream A Lil Dream Of Me (York) Two-year-old well broken tri dog, beautifully turned out and presented. Handsome headpiece, large eyes, very good tan placement and color which is so important on a tri dog. He was well constructed dog, all in balance. Good arch of neck, good front assembly, hard topline, and well angulated hind end. Moved with reach and very good drive, using today's big ring to his full advantage. Straight

silky coat, well broken, with rich tan markings. This dog was perfectly fit, in full bloom, and never stopped showing.

2. Chadwick Cheers at Hudsonview, C-RN (Glynn) This two year old boy had a beautiful headpiece with big dark eyes, frontally placed and a soft expression. Blanketed tri but with rich tan markings and straight coat texture, which are highly desirable features in a tri dog. Balanced proportion, moderate angulation, and pleasing side gait. In my consideration this day, I thought he needed a bit of time to muscle up and for his full coat to come in. 3. Chewcreek Red Solo Cup, JW (DePhillip) This is a smaller dog but very pretty and typey with much to recommend him. I liked his soft expression, cobby shape, and straight silky coat. Balanced front and rear and moved with his tail off his back. In my evaluation this day, I thought he needed additional physical conditioning through his hind end to allow him to move out with the bigger-moving dogs in his class. 4. Bonitos Campaneros Nothing Compares (Bialek/Kirschbaum/Vorderstrasse) More masculine but handsome headpiece on this tri boy. Large round dark eyes, well cushioned beneath. Shown in abundant coat of straight silky texture. Beautifully turned out and presented. Special Limit Ruby Dog (2)

1. Darane Hellboy, JW (Kates) Really lovely 2 1/2 year old ruby dog. He had very large, dark eyes, well cushioned beneath, and good ear set, creating a sweet, melting expression. I particularly liked that he was a moderate size dog with ample bone and cushioning. Good prosternum and depth of chest, well sprung ribs, hocks well let down. He had rich red color and dark pigment, and outstanding coat quality. Presented in beautiful condition. *Best Ruby Dog* 2. Mileslip With A Little Luck of Tailgate (Skidmore) Slightly larger ruby dog. Handsome headpiece with large eyes and moderate head shape. This was a pleasing dog to examine and to watch move--a structurally sound, well angulated, big moving toy spaniel.

Open Dog (5)

- 1. Ch Forestcreek Royal Harry, JW (Castrogiovanni) This blenheim boy caught my eye from across the ring with his correct Cavalier proportion and sheer ring presence. Beautiful headpiece of correct proportion with large dark frontally placed eyes and slight fill underneath giving him the characteristic soft Cavalier expression. He was a pleasure to examine, with good depth of chest, well-laid shoulders, level topline, well-sprung ribs, short loin, and well-developed hind-quarters. He was balanced and efficient on the move, with good reach and drive, and true coming and going. Presented in beautiful physical condition, well-muscled with silky, straight coat in full bloom. Winners Dog, Best in Show, Best Blenheim in Show, Best American Bred in Show
- 2. Ch Bonitos Companeros Kaleo at Diorchavon (Bialek) Outstanding type on this blenheim dog. Beautiful moderate head of correct proportion, with soft expression. Good proportion of body, level topline, good tail set, balanced movement. 3. Ch Chadwick Midnight Sun at Hudsonview (Glynn) Tri dog in full bloom. Abundant coat of correct silky coat texture, rich well-placed tan, handsome headpiece. Level topline, good tail carriage, balanced front and rear. Pleasing balanced side gait with his tail carried off his back. A real showman, beautifully shown. Best Tricolor Dog 4. Ch Turretbank Magic Spell (Green/Sloan) Black and tan dog of abundant quality. He had a beautiful head with no exaggeration: correct proportion, lovely large dark eyes and well set ears giving him a melting expression. I liked that he was a moderate size dog with good bone and cushioning. Outstanding coat quality and rich red tan markings, dark pigment. Best Black & Tan Dog

Junior Puppy Bitch (7)

1. Linrica Orange Blossom (Hsiung) Eight-month-old blenheim girl with attractive headpiece and particularly good large dark eyes creating the limpid Cavalier expression. Balanced side gait with good reach and drive and tail carried off her back. Good coat quality. 2. Mileslip Just in Time at Streffield (Lefferts/Skidmore) Five-month-old feminine ruby girl. Pretty face with large dark eyes and good earset framing her pretty face. Cobby with short loin, good tailset, hocks well let down. Pleasing side gait and good coming and going. 3. Kean Candied Violet (Keane) Five-month-old blenheim girl. Plush face with round dark eyes and good pigment. Good bone and substance and overall movement. Very showy girl. 4. Padamere Love Potion (Miller) Ruby girl, five months old with good bone and substance. Attractive moderate headpiece and pleasing expression. Balanced front and rear with reach and drive on side gait.

Senior Puppy Bitch (7)

- 1. Chadwick Drama (Eckersley) Eleven-month-old blenheim girl. Pretty, feminine, moderate headpiece. She was a very pleasing dog to examine with good angles, level topline, short loin, good tail set, good turn of stifle, and short hocks. Clean coming and going and particularly pleasing side gait, moving in balance with reach and drive, holding her topline level and tail off her back. *Best Puppy Bitch, Best Puppy in Show*
- **2. Darane Stardust** (Kates) Ten-month-old ruby girl with the sweetest face and expression. Very large dark frontally placed eyes, ears well set. Cobby, short loin, good side gait with level topline and tail carried level off her back. Rich red ruby color and straight coat. **3. Hiddencreek Butterscotch Schnapps** (Parente/Green) Another good one in this class. Eleven-month-old blenheim bitch with big dark frontally placed eyes, good pigment, good shape,

topline, tailset, balanced side gait. **4. Kellene Once Upon A Time** (Marshall) Almost eleven-month-old ruby girl. Moderate girl with large dark eyes, rich ruby color, and pleasing side gait.

Graduate Puppy Bitch (5)

- 1. Piccadil Castle On A Cloud (York) I liked this girl for her shape, substance, and head type. Very pretty face, well cushioned, beautiful large dark eyes with soft expression. Lovely arch of neck and cobby body of proper proportion--slightly longer than tall, equal distance shoulder to elbow, elbow to ground. Level topline, short loin. Very showy girl with outstanding coat quality, physical conditioning, and presentation. 2. Linrica Moonwalk, JW (Liu) This girl had a beautiful headpiece and expression. Similar in type to #1. Also very well presented. 3. Angel's Pride Pippa, JW (Green) This tri bitch had an adorable face with lovely large dark round eyes. She was heavily marked but had well placed, rich tan markings, which is so important in a tri dog. The two in front of her were shorter bodied and had a bit more leg underneath them. 4. Kalais Falling Springs Briar Rose (Cornog/Hess) Ruby girl with large dark eyes and good coat quality and rich ruby color. Good shape and topline, balanced side gait. Novice Bitch (2)
- **1. Embee's Lady Luck at Mileslip** (Skidmore) Black and tan girl with lovely eyes, cobby body with well sprung ribs, straight silky coat texture. **2. Blueday Here Comes Trouble** (Gross) Blenheim girl with adorable head and really lovely eyes. She was a charming little girl, showy and happy, and at times just a bit over exuberant. **Bred By Exhibitor Bitch (5)**
- 1. Ch Autumnhill Desire Me, JW (Parente) Beautifully balanced moderate bitch in full coat and show condition. I loved her overall balance and structure. Moderate pleasing head with slight fill beneath her dark round eyes, ears set high but not close, framing her face. She was a one-piece dog, balanced front and rear with a deep forechest, tight elbows, good spring of rib, strong topline and short loin. Good arch of neck leading to well-angulated shoulders. Matching rear angle with good turn of stifle and hocks well let down. She moved with exceptional reach and drive, her tail carried right off her back. True coming and going. We had a big ring today and this girl used it to her full advantage. She never put a foot wrong. She earned her win in her quality-filled Bred By Exhibitor class. *Reserve Winners Bitch. Best Ruby in Show*
- 2. Ch Truluv Aly (Nikaci) I particularly liked this tri girl's moderate size with cobby shape and good bone, and balanced outline which she held both standing and on the move. Very attractive head with large eyes, well cushioned beneath, proper earset, particularly nice ear leathers, and good tri markings. Short coupled with good spring of rib, good tail set. Balanced side gait carrying her topline level. Show fit and showing well today. Best Tricolor in Show 3. Ch Linrica Just A Dream, JW (Hsiung/Liu) Tri bitch with beautiful headpiece and good tri markings. I liked her moderate size, proportion, short loin, and silky coat texture. Today I thought the girls in front of her held their outline better on the move. 4. Grandville Earth Angel (Grandemange) Slightly larger blenheim girl with good overall structure and bone. Large dark eyes, well cushioned beneath, well set ears with long ear leathers. Well angulated with good side gait.

Junior American Bred Bitch (5)

- 1. Bluegarden Exclusive (Matos/Glynn) Twelve-month-old blenheim bitch with very pretty feminine headpiece. Lovely shape, side gait, level topline and tailset. She just needs to body up. 2. Piccadil The Spy Who Loved Me (York) Blenheim girl of good make and shape. Lovely moderate headpiece, large eye, balanced movement. 3. Dreamvale Follow Fashion, JW (Sage/Colbert) Very pretty, typey girl. Beautiful headpiece and great coat quality. Good bone and substance. My notes say she amused me with her antics today! 4. Mileslip Pretty Please (Skidmore) Ruby girl with moderate headpiece and round dark eye. Good side gait, coat texture and rich red color. American Bred Bitch (5)
- 1. Foxwyn A Likely Story (Baker-Fox, Comer/Greak) I loved this blenheim girl's type. Beautiful headpiece--large dark eyes frontally placed, slight stop, slight cushioning beneath eyes, skull slightly rounded but appeared flat when her ears were alert. Correct shape, slightly longer than tall. Level topline, balanced, short coupled. 2. Piaffe In The Tulips (Rychlik) Another nice bitch in this class. Pleasing head with large eye, good reach and drive, tail off her back. Slightly longer cast than #1. 3. Chadwick Pimms at Hytea (Eckersley/Reichardt) Well-coated blenheim girl. Again, very nice dark eyes. Well laid shoulders with good reach. Prepared and presented well. Somewhat longer cast than the class winner. 4. Blueday What's The Rumpus (Gross) Blenheim bitch with large eyes, well cushioned beneath. Level topline, balanced side gait. Presented well and showing well.

Special Limit Blenheim Bitch (7)

1. Foxwyn Tell Me A Story (Baker-Fox) I loved this bitch's type, just as I did her sister, who won the American Bred class. Lovely head and soft Cavalier expression. I liked her moderate size with sufficient bone, good spring of rib, dark pigment, rich red blenheim color, and coat quality. **2. Seraphaven Put A Spell On You** (Gogol) Slightly larger, moderate blenheim girl. Her head was of correct proportion, good earset, pleasing expression. Correct proportion of body--slightly longer than tall. She had well laid shoulders and good reach. Pleasing balanced side gait

holding her topline level. This bitch was well prepared and presented. I only would have preferred to see her tail "in constant characteristic motion" when she was in action. **4. Linrica Honey Girl** (Liu) Blenheim girl with attractive headpiece, again with large dark eyes. Good substance, good spring of rib, and nice side gait. **4. Clopsville Flirtini** (Rychlik) Pretty-headed blenheim girl with lovely eyes. Good arch of neck, good bone, in balance. She was slightly longer cast than the girls in front of her.

Special Limit Tricolor Bitch (1)

- **1. Sherah Sophia Loren** (Crommett) Tri girl with sweet expression and large round eyes, which you don't always see on a tri dog. I liked her proportion of skull and proportion of body--small, cobby, with good bone. Ample coat. **Special Limit Ruby Bitch** (2)
- 1. Truluv Summer Breeze (Nikaci) Quality, moderate ruby girl. Correct proportions of skull with slight stop, slight cushioning beneath her eyes, back skull slightly rounded but appearing flat when her properly placed ears were alert. Large limpid dark eyes giving her a pleasing Cavalier expression. Slightly longer than tall, good bone. Good arch of neck leading to well-laid shoulders, good spring of rib, strong hindquarters. Well angulated, true coming and going, good reach and drive and moved with her tail off her back. Silky straight, rich ruby coat. 2. Kalidunn Cherry Chill at Lilycroft (Karcher) Smaller ruby girl. Large eyes, good ear set and ear leathers, good arch of neck, correct shape. Good coat quality. I would like to see more body and more fill under her eyes.

Special Limit Black & Tan Bitch (1)

1. Kalais Never Too Late To Party (Hess) This black and tan girl was just what I was looking for in a Cavalier--a typey, moderate size, cobby dog with ample bone, sufficient leg under her, and good angulation. Her headpiece was moderate and of correct proportion with slight stop, slight cushioning under her large round eyes, and correct proportions of skull. Ears set high but not close, fanning forward to frame her pretty face when alert. Good arch of neck leading to a moderate shoulder angle, good depth of chest, spring of rib, short loin, hard, level topline, strong hindquarters. Her rear angle matched her front. She was a small, compact, one-piece dog of ample substance. She held her outline moving, always in balance with good drive, tail off her back. True coming and going. Straight silky coat, presented in excellent condition and showing with true Cavalier character. This little dog owned our big ring today. Winners Bitch, Reserve Best in Show, Best of Opposite Sex, Best Black & Tan in Show, Best Bred By Exhibitor in Show, Best American Bred Bitch

Open Bitch (4)

1. Ch Brookhaven I'm No Angel, JW (Ayers/Martz) I adored this little blenheim girl for her type and overall quality. Ample substance in compact toy dog package, with correct proportion of length to height, and equal distance shoulder to elbow, elbow to ground. I was taken with her huge dark round eyes and soft Cavalier expression. Straight front legs. Elegant, well arched neck, which is not always seen on a short-coupled dog. Good spring of rib, level topline. Moderate angles and balanced front and rear, creating a lovely picture standing and on the move. This bitch pressed hard in the winner's class. Best Blenheim Bitch 2. Ch Chadwick Leura, JW (Eckersley) Another top quality bitch in this class. Blenheim girl with moderate headpiece and correct proportion of skull. This was a very pleasing bitch to examine, with good arch of neck, depth of chest, tight elbows, well laid shoulders, good spring of rib, and a strong hind end. She moved with reach and drive. Although they excelled in different areas, I considered this class a close choice between #1 and #2. 3. Covington Hot Dish at Rockcreek (Steagall/Mohn) Balanced moderate girl with attractive head, good arch of neck, depth of chest, spring of rib. Moved with reach and drive, with her tail off her back. 4. Ch Nightingale Goldilocks at Nebula (Birbeck) This was a typey little bitch with lovely eyes and expression. Moderate size with good bone, front movement, spring of rib, and tail set and carriage.

Senior Open Bitch (1)

1. Ch Chadwick Laphroaig, JW (Eckersley) Ten-year-old blenheim girl holding her own in our big ring. Moderate headpiece, correct proportion of body, good depth of chest, lovely neck leading into well-laid shoulders. Short loin, well-angulated behind, good tail set and carriage. Still moving with reach and drive at ten years old, which was a joy to watch. I thought the three girls I examined from this kennel today felt quite similar under my hands, with many of the same qualities.

Veteran Dog (2)1. Piaffe Lord of the Dance (Rychlik) Almost eight-year-old blenheim boy. Lovely typey head, strong topline and good side gait. Sound moving showy dog. *Best Veteran in Show*

2. Pippindale Knickerbocker at Kilspindie (Spalding/Hansen) Fourteen-year-old larger blenheim boy. More up on leg and showing some grey at fourteen but very much enjoying his day.

Veteran Bitch (3)

1. Sherah Stars and Stripes, CD, C-CD, RE, C-RAE, Delta (Rychlik) Eleven-year-old tri girl. Cobby shape and plush head with lovely eyes.
