DOGS JUNIOR PUPPY DOG (2)

- 1) **CHARTEROAK WILD HEARTS** (Obadowski). Balanced blen just six months who was short coupled with good ribbing. Correct bone for size. Correctly set and carried tail. Such a pretty head marking. Liked his happy and outgoing disposition.
- 2) **CROWNROSE AS YOU WISH** (Rosenberg/Rosenberg). Heavier marked blen all through. Slightly longer over loin than winner. Lovely bone for size. A little proud of his tail at present, but that is a boy thing. Not so positive on the move going away.

SENIOR PUPPY DOG (1)

 DREAMVALE CASANOVA (Sage). Well bodied baby and at one year old looks very promising. Has great pigmentation throughout and very attractively marked. Has nice angled quarters fore and rear with correct moderate bone. Very steady on the move out and back, and in profile super temperament. He pleased me very much in all aspects. <u>BEST PUPPY DOG & BEST PUPPY IN SHOW</u>.

GRADUATE PUPPY DOG (2)

 ORCHARDHILL DISARMING (Venier/Hallett). He suited his name. Solidly marked Blen which was a rich colour. Large dark eyes and dark pigmented nose leather. Headpiece which is masculine but pretty too with well set and carried ears which are well furnished. Good neck into well placed shoulders. Firm topline. A tad longer in couplings, but he is young and needs to develop more depth overall. Moved steadily in all directions pushing off from well let down hocks and strong hindquarters. <u>RESERVE</u> <u>WINNERS DOG & RESERVE BEST IN SHOW.</u>

2) **COBBHILL POLISHED ROSEWOOD** (Emler-Maclean) Another solidly marked blen which was rich in colour. Finer boned and shorter coupled than winner. Loved his happy temperament and easy manner. Moved well.

NOVICE DOG (3)

- 1) AUTUMN HILL AMERICA'S TEAM (Parente). B/T loved the outline on this happy showy little dog. Moderately boned. Very attractive headpiece with good neck into well placed shoulders. Firm and well held topline on the stand and on the move. short couplings. Lustrous black coat with rich red tans. Showed himself well.
- 2) **KELLENE SHORTSTOP** (Carter). Well pigmented blen. At 15 months was slightly finer boned than winner. Good topline and tailset. He moved and showed well. Another happy exhibit who was enjoying the limelight.
- 3) **NIGHTINGALE TAKE IT EASY** (Mulligan). attractively headed blen who has all the attributes with large dark eyes. Good pigmentation throughout and very well coated. A little unsure of himself and his surroundings today. Perhaps he was just unhappy. Didn't move with confidence so not so steady on the out and back.

BRED BY EXHIBITOR DOG (4)

- 1) **CLARMARION HEARTHROB** (Young May/Gogol) Well-marked blen with expressive head coming from dark round eyes. Excellent pigment to nose leather. For me I would prefer a little more neck. His overall shape and demeanour won this class. He moved and showed very well.
- 2) **CH NIGHTINGALE WIPEOUT** (Mulligan) 5 yr old blen. Well presented with wonderful coat condition. Well pigmented, a little longer over the loin than winner. He showed himself well. Moving with verve and drive.
- CEILIMOR DRESS CODE (Eckersley/McCarty). Well broken blen with correct bone for size. Excellent pigmentation. Beautiful soft coat condition. Firm topline. Moved out well.
- 4) **CH KRYSTLE HAMILTON** (Torgersen/Torgersen) A showy blen. Who was a little unsure of himself initially. However, he seemed to settle and made a good show moving out and back.

JUNIOR AMERICAN BRED DOG (1)

 FIELDSEDGE BURNING DOWN THE HOUSE (Slusher/Slusher). 16 month Ruby who stood alone in this class. The first thing you notice is the richness of colour throughout. Large dark eyes well placed and carried ears. Good neck into well placed shoulders. Good depth to fore-chest and rib. Correct bone throughout, firm topline and well set on tail. On the stand he presented well. Has a steady but firm action moving out and back, and in profile looked good carrying his tail well. I surprised myself yet again (another whole colour) and awarded him <u>WINNERS DOG, BEST AMERICAN BRED, BEST BRED BY EXHIBITOR, BEST RUBY IN SHOW & BEST IN SHOW</u>.

AMERICAN BRED DOG (1)

1) **CARLEN TINY TIM TATER TOT** (Close). 18 month well broken blen. Lovely dark eyes and good pigment Would have preferred a little more refinement in the head, but what a happy showy little man he is. Strode out well in all directions.

SPECIAL LIMIT BLENHEIM DOG (2)

- FIELDSEDGE PADRAIG (Slusher/Slusher). Blen with excellent pigment. Good to go over. Good balance throughout. Correct bone. Good depth to rib and fore chest. Nice angles. Good depth of 2nd thigh. Firm topline and well set on tail. Good quality coat which was soft and silky. his overall exuberance at times made it difficult for his handler. However, when he settled, he moved with a firm and positive action.
- 2) BLUE SKYE'S NAPAL'S HIDDEN GEM (Colacchio). Slightly larger all through than class winner. Good head with well-placed ears giving that desired flat top to head. Dark eyes and good pigment. Good quality coat and furnishings. His handler needs to move him faster as he kept falling into a pacing action. Nice boy.

SPECIAL LIMIT TRICOLOUR DOG (1)

1) **CHADWICK SILVER CLOUD** (Courtney). Short coupled Classically marked boy with large white collar. Lustrous quality coat with rich tans. He has good angles fore and aft. Happy showy little dog who moved and showed well.

SPECIAL LIMIT RUBY DOG (1)

 DREAMVALE RED HAIR N BLACK LEATHER (Sage/Colbert). Stood alone in this class. 18 months correct head piece good pigment on nose leather and large dark eyes. Adequate bone throughout. well ribbed. Firm topline. Richly pigmented coat and furnishings. Easy going action on the out and back and very tidy in side profile when moving.

SPECIAL LIMIT BLACK AND TAN DOG (2)

- 1) **EMBEES WRITTEN IN THE STARS** (Menkes). Pretty headed little man with adequate bone for size. I liked his overall shape and demeanour. Just wish he was a tad bigger. He showed very well. Moving out.
- 2) **DREAMVALE HOLLYWOOD NIGHTS** (Sage/Perini). Larger than winner and not so animated. Wasn't giving his best. Good coat and condition

<u>OPEN DOG</u> (4)

- BONITOS COMPANEROS ORINOCO (Hess/Meager) 5-year blen with correct head piece with balance to foreface and skull ratio. Large round dark eyes. Rich pigmentation to eye rims and nose leather. Well set and carried ear leathers which were well feathered. Good neck into gently sloping shoulders. Good depth to fore-chest and well sprung rib. Adequate bone throughout with good depth to 2nd thigh. Well angulated rear quarters. So much to like and so good to handle at close quarters. However, he was unsettled at times but eventually pulled his act together for me to assess him properly. In the final challenge, he was unhappy. I later learned he had a change of handler at the last moment, which rather spoilt his day. He did enough to win the <u>AWARD OF MERIT #1</u>.
- CH STONEPIT MASTERMIND (Gentil). Well broken blen with soft silky coat and furnishing. Good pigmentation. Moved well enough to show of his virtues. Happy little man. <u>AWARD OF MERIT #2</u>.

3) CH FALLING SPRINGS JUST FOR YOU AT CROWNROSE

(Rosenberg/Rosenberg). richly marked blen with large white collar. Has dark limpid eyes and richly pigmented nose leather. Well set and carried ears.I liked his outline and his happy outlook, with his constantly wagging tail. He moved well, but could be a little tighter in front action.

CH CHARDOMONT CHADWICK GHOST STORY OF CEILIMOR (Eckersley/McCarty). Another happy chappy who was enjoying his time. Well broken blen markings. Great coat condition. And showed well.

SENIOR OPEN DOG (1)

1) CH KELLENE BACKSEAT BOY (Carter). Very active 9-year-old Tri. Almost a full complement of teeth, attractive head and expression excellent coat and condition. Moved and showed well.

BITCHES

JUNIOR PUPPY BITCH (2)

- 1) **SERAPHAVEN WYLD FLOWER** (Gogol/May). Extremely pretty headed blen with soulful eyes. Well-proportioned head top accentuated by correctly placed ears. Elegant neckline into well-placed shoulders. Has a good topline and moved and showed with great aplomb.
- 2) **KELLENE HONEY BUNCH** (Marshall). 6-month ruby with the richest colour. Correct all through for this delicate age and as I would expect. She has a pretty headpiece with large dark eyes. Framed by large ear leathers. She moved and showed well.

SENIOR PUPPY BITCH (2)

- NIGHTINGALE HEARTACHE TONIGHT (Mulligan). Classic outline on this pretty blen girl. Well-proportioned head. With good top skull and correct nose length. Moderately boned throughout. Good shoulder, firm top line. Very assured mover out and back. Great in profile carrying her tail in line with her backline.
- 2) **NORTHPOINT HOT GOSSIP** (Mitcham). Slightly different in head shape to winner. Good top skull with well set and placed ears. Loved her richly pigmented nose leather and eye rims. Well broken colour with her pearly white furnishings. Liked her overall make and shape. Showed well, not so positive on her going away.

GRADUATE PUPPY BITCH (2)

- CEDAR CREEK LIP SMACKIN GOOD (Mehrens/Owens) What a happy showy little madam. So pretty with fabulous pigment. Dark eyes. Great finish to top skull with enough fill in foreface. Good shoulder nicely ribbed with moderate bone throughout. Firm topline and well set and carried tail. Moved with purpose and drive around the ring.
- 2) FALLING SPRINGS BRAND NEW MORNING (Curley). A lovely exhibit in all aspects. Pretty head with correct ear placement. Prettily marked and broken blen coat markings. Good for balance throughout. Not moving as well as winner. I would be happy for this little one to live at my house.

<u>NOVICE BITCH</u> (3)

1) **NIGHTINGALE ONE OF THESE GOLDEN NIGHTS** (Richards). At 9 months this very pretty and classically headed blen has so much promise for the future. She presents a gorgeous outline standing. Is moderately boned throughout. Elegant neck into well placed

shoulders continuing into a firm topline and well set on tail. Great hind angles which allowed her to move with elegance and drive. *BEST PUPPY BITCH*.

- 2) **KELLENE SWEET SPOT** (Marshall) Blen who was not as outgoing as winner. Moderate in bone and size. Presented good topline and tailset. Good pigmentation throughout.
- 3) **FALLING SPRINGS ROSE OF SHARON AT JEMANDA** (Weinstein). Slightly larger all through ruby who presented a good overall shape. Large limpid eyes and superb pigmentation throughout. Feel this bitch could do better. Her handler needs to speed her up a little as she tends to laziness and paces.

BRED BY EXHIBITOR (1)

1) CH CLARMARIAN AFFAIRS OF THE HEART (McFarland/Gogol). Very pretty blen with a classic head shape. Huge well set and carried ear leathers which were heavily fringed. Wonderful coat condition which was attractively marked. Presented a lovely shape on the stand with good angulation fore and rear. Great in profile on the go around, just not so positive going away.

JUNIOR AMERICAN BRED BITCH (4) "A class of pretty blenheims!"

- FIELDSEDGE GOTTA DANCE (Slusher/Slusher) Well broken blen who presents a clean outline. Pretty head with large dark expressive eyes. Good ear carriage with lots of fringing. Moderately boned throughout. Elegant neck into well placed shoulders. Short couplings. Moved well in all directions carrying her tail in line with her firm backline.
- 2) **LINRICA VERENNA** (Hsiumg/Liu). Much applies as to the winner. Correctly sized and moderately boned throughout. Rich pigmentation to nose leather and large expressive eyes. Moved and showed well.
- 3) **SERAPHAVEN FLOWER** (Gogol/Young May). And what a flower this pretty little 7month lady is. Well broken markings. Lovely outline with a promising future I would think. An accomplished mover enjoying herself.
- 4) **CHADWICK VIVID VIOLET OF CEILIMOR** (McCarty/Eckersley). Longer cast and at 9 months needs to fill in the middle. Sweet headpiece with super ear placement which are already well fringed. Good pigmentation throughout. Moved and showed well.

AMERICAN BRED BITCH (3)

1) **BROOKHAVEN TREASURE HUNTER** (Parente). 2-year-old blen. Loved her head and expression coming from limpid dark eyes. Dark eye rims and nose leather. Flat top skull with high-set and carried ears, which were well furnished. Solidly marked and

richly pigmented coat which was of good quality. Moderately boned throughout, moved very well. *RESERVE WINNERS BITCH*

- 2) VALENTYNE SCANDALOUS AT PIAFFE (Rychlik/O'Brien). Shorter coupled than winner but with well broken blen markings. Good quality, soft silky coat. Super pigmentation throughout. Happy showy little lady.
- 3) **LIVELYOAK CROWNROSE A LITTLE BIT ALEXIS** (Rosenberg/Rosenberg). Well-balanced headpiece. Correctly placed and feathered ears in between which carried that much-valued blen spot. Happy showy little girl who moved and showed well.

SPECIAL LIMIT BLENHEIM BITCH (2)

- 1) **CHADWICK LOOKING FOR TROUBLE** (Greak/Eckersley). Attractive headpiece with well-placed ears framing her face. Pretty eyes which were expressive. Extremely attentive to handler who showed and handled well.
- 2) **FIELDSEDGE THERE IS NO PLACE LIKE HOME** (Slusher/Slusher). I think this exhibitor must clone their dogs. Such a pretty headed girl with large dark eyes to die for. Good quality silky coat. Presenting such a lovely outline. She was unhappy in the ring and not sure of herself giving her handler a difficult time. Such a shame as I really liked her.

SPECIAL LIMIT TRICOLOUR BITCH (1)

 ORCHARDHILL CURIOUSER AND CURIOUSER (Venier/Venier). Stood alone in this class. The markings on this 2-year-old are which we all wish to achieve. Enough tan in all the required places. Lovely size. short over the loin. Nicely balanced throughout. Handled well and showed so well. Positive in action on the move in all directions. Lovely girl. *BEST TRI COLOR IN SHOW & AWARD OF MERIT #1*

SPECIAL LIMIT RUBY BITCH (2)

- 1) CARLEN OCEAN BREEZE (Close). 2-year-old with classic head and eye. Excellent pigmentation. Moderate bone and good in front and rear angulation. Seemed a little unsure on the out and back but then pulled herself together when asked to move on the go around I liked her profile.
- 2) **PINNACLEE A SKY FULL OF STARS** (Obadowski/Bennett). Pretty girl with all the attributes of this charmed breed. Beautiful coat condition. Was happy to show but moving **very close** behind on the out and back. A lovely bitch.

OPEN BITCH (2)

- CH ORCHARDHILL DIVERSIFIED (Venier/Venier). Well broken 2-year-old blen. Classic head shape with dark eyes. Good set to ears creating that desired flat top to skull. So good to go over and handles well on inspection. Moderately boned throughout. Presenting a clean outline. Super profile in action. Moved with steady gait in all directions. WINNERS BITCH & BEST OPPOSITE SEX
- 2) CH FALLING SPRINGS CROWNROSE BLACK VELVET JW, AW (Rosenberg/Rosenberg). Black and Tan lady with correctly proportioned headpiece liked the set of ear leathers which were well furnished. Moderately boned throughout. Liked her angulation front and back. Raven black silky coat and fringing. Rich clean tans. A tidy exhibit. <u>BEST BLACK AND TAN IN SHOW</u>

SENIOR OPEN BITCH (1)

CH AUTUMNHILL DESIRE ME (Parente). Well, she suits her name to a "T". who wouldn't want her. What an absolute delight this richly coloured ruby girl presented today. Dark eye rims and nose nose leather. Those large round dark pools of eyes melted me when I looked into her beautiful face. I was amazed to be told she is 12 years old yet her stature and condition was excellent. A lovely size. A toy spaniel exuding confidence and showmanship. When she moved to further show off her charms, her out and back and profile movement was exceptional, positive and strong. Her breeders and owners must be truly delighted with their work.
