I enjoy very much what I do so it is very important to be kind to the dogs and exhibitors and make everyone feel that they have exactly the same chance. At the end of the day I can only make one person happy, but we can all have fun and be professional getting there.

I would like to thank the Committee for their excellent organization and the superb hospitality shown to Stephen and myself. My special Big Thank you goes to Joe and Betty Ann Birbeck, the Show Chairpersons. Such warm lovely people and nothing was too much trouble to make sure we were so well looked after.

I also have to say a big Thank you to Jeffrey Weinstein and his lovely wife for the invitation to his beautiful home in the middle of a forest where they hosted a barbecue for the club members. Stephen and I were delighted to be included. The food was beautiful and it was a special night. Lovely people.

The quality of dogs at the show was of a very high standard and it was interesting that over the 3 days there were different winners. We all interpret the standard in our own way and from the other show results I can see we put importance on different parts of the standard. This is why we keep coming back. Under the FCI Show system we grade dogs as we judge and with the quality of the dogs at the show I would have had a very high percentage of Excellence and this to me means the Club is very much going in the right direction.

What I liked very much was the shape and size of the bodies with beautiful heads and lovely soft expressions. Excellent grooming for the major part. What I did not like was tail set and tails too high on the back. I thought the Males were stronger than the Females and I found that in the Females the expressions were good, however, a lot of the heads were too small for the bodies.

Here is my report from my winners. Hope to see you all again sometime. It's an honest opinion and I do not mean to offend anyone. I say what I saw.

JUNIOR PUPPY DOG (3)

1. **DREAMVALE DEVIL WITHOUT A CAUSE** - (Perini/Sage) Caught my eye immediately. I liked him very much. Had the advantage in this class as he was older and more mature. Excellent shape and size. Lovely head and soft expression. Excellent topline. Full of confidence. So well trained and moved very well. I predict a very big future for this boy. Well deserved winner of <u>**BEST PUPPY DOG**</u> and <u>**BEST PUPPY IN SHOW**</u>.

2. FIELDSEDGE ITS A SMALL WORLD – (Slusher/Slusher)

Has some nice qualities and good breed type. Just needs to mature and develop and grow into his body. Nice head with nice sparkling eyes. At the moment he looks a little high on leg and topline could be stronger. Very reluctant on the move and needs to build on confidence.

3. NEBYULA DO YOU BELIEVE IN MAGIC – (Birbeck/Birbeck)

Very cute and lovely personality. But for me too feminine in type and I hope he makes the correct size. The head need time to develop and at the moment the muzzle is too weak. Front movement could also be better.

SENIOR PUPPY DOG (5)

1. CHADWICK ACE OF SPADES - (Eckersley)

Excellent outline. Perfect balance. Very masculine head. Lovely dark round eyes and a really soft expression. Correct bone. Excellent markings. Moved well in front and hind action. Carrying a little bit of weight and the neck could be slightly stronger. Excellent breed type. Will have a great future.

2. **ORCHARDHILL TRUE NORTH** – (Venier/Venier)

Very mature for his age and in beautiful condition. Strong masculine head. Lovely soft expression. Strong topline. Leg could be slightly higher. Today, unfortunately, did not move very well. Kept the head low and lacked drive in the hind action. Lovely personality on the stand that did not continue on the move.

3. KELLENE BACKSEAT BOY – (Carter)

Very pretty head and nice soft expression. Correct bone. Topline could be stronger on the move. For balance, I would prefer a shorter back. Very sound in movement in both front and hind action. Strong class and very close decision to the number 2 spot.

4. ALMEARA I BELIEVE – (Parente)

Nice looking dog with, again, an excellent head and nice expression. Needs time to mature and develop and grow into his body. Good bone, but today looks too high on leg. When the chest deepens, the balance will be better. Nice rich colour. Moved well.

GRADUATE PUPPY DOG (1)

1. CHADWICK TELLTALE AUTHOR, JW – (Eckersley)

In top condition. Very mature for his age. Excellent balance of head with correct width between the ears. Large dark round eyes. Soft expression. Heavy in markings. Deep chest strong topline. Excellent reach in front movement. My only criticism is back could be slightly shorter to balance the outline. Sound movement. Will have an excellent future in the show ring. Was considered strongly in my decision for best male.

NOVICE DOG (2)

1. NIGHTINGALE TATOO - (Mulligan/Duke)

He has a lot of qualities and excellent breed type. If I were judging under the FCI standard, I would have had to downgrade because he is undershot, but under your standard it is accepted and all his other qualities exceed this problem. But I had to mention it. It did not in anyway effect his lovely expression. However, I did find him, for me, to be a little feminine in type. Excellent topline and moved well.

2. CRISTAL'S TROPPER ANGEL (Solino)

For some reason this is not on the results page on the website. Far too tall in leg. Body is too long. Head is not strong enough and the muzzle is far too long. Expression not typical and not good breed type. But a lovely coat, excellent temperament and very happy to be in the ring. Personally, in my opinion, not a show dog, but a wonderful pet and will make his owner very happy.

BRED BY EXHIBITOR DOG (2) "Very strong class. Had 2 beautiful dogs here."

1. CH FORESTCREEK DOUBLE O SEVEN, JW - (Cline)

Really Beautiful strong masculine head. Muzzle of perfect width and length. Excellent shape. Very nicely marked. Strong bone and correct topline. For me he is a little bit stuffy in the neck and moved a little close behind. Coat texture could be better. He won the class because of his beautiful head.

2. CH LINRICA MILAN, JW – (Liu)

Excellent breed type. Smaller than the winner. In top condition and beautifully presented. Colour nicely broken. Nicely balanced head and correct expression, but not as strong as winner. Strong neck. For me the leg could have had just a little more height and carried the tail on occasions a bit too high on the move.

JUNIOR AMERICAN BRED DOG (2)

- ORCHARDHILL ENOUGH SAID (Venier/Venier) Stunning head. Beautiful soft expression. Still very young and needs to mature and develop and grow into his body. For me, just a little big and would prefer a shorter leg and less length in the back. Beautiful coat and well presented. Needs to steady up on the move.
- KELLENE HIT THE ROAD JACK (Marshall) Very nice temperament. Looked much younger than his age. I just found him too small for a male. I would have like a larger head and stronger bones. Correct texture coat. Moved well.

AMERICAN BRED DOG (5)

CHADWICK SHOOTING UPWARDS - (McCarty/Eckersley)
 For me, this Dog was just too big and the bone too heavy, but he won class because he
 had so many good qualities. Beautiful strong head. Typical expression. In top condition

and beautifully presented. One of the best movers today with well laid back shoulders and strong hind action. Excellent tail carriage and wonderful temperament.

2. **HIDDENCREEK ONE SHOT OF PATRON** – (Weinstein/Green)

This was the boy who caught my eye when I first looked at the class. Excellent outline and shape. Strong masculine head. Correct bone and correct coat. A pleasure to go over on the table. The neck could just have been slightly stronger. Unfortunately, he lost the class on the move. Was lacking in energy and kept the head too low. Needed a lot more drive in the hind action. Excellent Breed type.

- FIELDSEDGE AVOGADROS NUMBER (Slusher/Slusher) Still quite young and needs to mature and develop in all areas. Today very much lacking in body. I also would have liked a larger head for a male, but the expression was nice. Moved well both front and hind action. Lovely eyes.
- LANCERS QUINCY ADAMS (La Roza) Excellent temperament. Nice coat and well presented. Not a very strong show dog, but nothing particularly wrong with him. Moved ok.

SPECIAL LIMIT BLENHEIM DOG (6)

"OMG. What a wonderful class to judge. I could see from my first walk around some beautiful Cavaliers and was excited to get my hands on them. Both my Winners Dog and Reserve Winners Dog came from this class."

 CH ALMEARA EXTRA EXTRAORDINARY, JW – (Whitmire) Excellent Breed type and some very nice qualities. In top condition. Body well balanced with correct depth of chest. Level back with strong hindquarters. Very sound in movement and strong masculine head. A worthy winner of <u>WINNERS DOG</u>, <u>RESERVE BEST IN SHOW, BEST OF OPPOSITE SEX. BEST BRED BY</u> <u>EXHIBITOR IN SHOW, BEST BRED BY EXHIBITOR DOG</u>.

2. CH DREAMVALE FOLLOW ALL MY MOVES - (Perini/Sage)

I just loved this boy. Stood out on my walk around. In my opinion the closest male to the breed standard and also the Best groomed Cavalier at the show. Not a hair out of place. Beautiful soft expression, which I preferred to the winner. Excellent movement. Unfortunately, on the move, he just carries his tail a little too high, which also affects the topline on the move. But could not pass him and he was a worthy winner of my *RESERVE WINNERS DOG*.

3. CH AVIA MAKE IT WORK – (Poti/Poti)

Again, excellent Breed type. Excellent shape and size. Correct head, lovely dark eyes and correct bone. Not as mature as the other two. Strong bones. Excellent presentation. Moved well, but would have liked more personality.

4. BLACKFIRE EXIT POLL – (Weidig/Kennedy)

What a lovely temperament. You could see how happy we was going around the ring and adored his owner. Correct shape head, but for me a little to high on leg and long on back. Moved ok, but not steady. Excellent coat and well presented.

SPECIAL LIMIT RUBY DOG (1)

1. HARANA HUEY LEWIS – (Gentil)

On the table I liked the shape very much and he very nice to go over. He was the correct size and the body was nicely balanced. Lovely deep ruby colour. Correct reach of neck. Head was fine, but I would have liked the muzzle to have more length. Unfortunately, today he did not move so well. Kept the head down and the movement did not flow.

SPECIAL LIMIT BLACK-AND-TAN DOG (1)

1. JOLLY JOUET DU JARDIN DE CLAIRE OF SUMARA – (Gentil)

I found him to be a little feminine in type, but the body shape was good. The head was just a little too rounded, and the ear set just a little too low, which gave this rounded effect. Muzzle also needed length and width. A little close behind and on occasion stepped a little high in front. Worthy winner of <u>BEST BLACK- and-TAN IN SHOW</u>, <u>BEST BLACK- and-TAN DOG</u>

OPEN DOG (8)

"Another very strong class with some beautiful Cavaliers, and now from the catalogue I can see most were Champions. More great decisions to be made. It was very difficult as all had strong qualities and breed type."

- CH NIGHTINGALE DIORCHAVON BABY ITS YOU, JW (Bialek) Very Masculine Strong Dog. Excellent bone. Nicely balanced head and a lovely expression. The movement was free and elegant with great drive from the hind action. He won this class on his expression and movement. For balance, the back could be slightly shorter, and at times the tail is a little high.
- 2. CH FORESTCREEK HEART OF ROCK N ROLL, JW (Gregory/Cline) Excellent Breed type. Very compact body. Stunning head. I just felt he was a little feminine in type compared to the winner. Excellent body and coat. A very nice Cavalier.

3. CH KABARET MILLION – (Meager/Wise)

This is a Ruby of superb quality. Delighted to award him Best Ruby in Show. Lovely rich colour. The body is short coupled with good spring of rib and level back. Very gentle expression and head of correct shape. Today his coat was not the best. Elbows could be tighter. Well deserved winner of <u>BEST RUBY IN SHOW and BEST RUBY</u> **DOG**.

4. CH CLOPSVILLE MERIDIAN – (Rychlik) Really strong powerful movement similar to the winner. In excellent condition with a beautiful coat and body. Masculine head and gentle expression. Excellent breed type. For me, I would have preferred a shorter back to balance the outline.

SENIOR OPEN DOG (1)

1. WELMFORTH SHOOTING STAR – (Lasser)

Always a pleasure to judge the Senior class. In lovely condition for his age, a credit to the owner. Excellent temperament and very happy to be in the ring. Nice little mover. Nicely balanced head and good expression. I would prefer if the leg were shorter. Excellent pigmentation for his age.

"So completed the Male Lineup. Delighted with my Winners and looked consistent when you looked down the line."

FEMALE CLASSES.

Result on the website for this one is incorrect. I have checked my Catalogue and Judges Book and this is the result.

JUNIOR PUPPY BITCH (3)

"This is the placing as I judged, however, I have now been told that my winner was disqualified."

Disqualified: (BONITOS COMPANEROS XAVIERA OF WELMFORTH (Lasser)

Very nice puppy with plenty of promise. Needs to mature and develop in all areas. At the moment she looks a little high on leg. Will have a very pretty head when it develops. Great confidence and strong hind action for her age. Still a little loose in the front.)

1. LINRICA IRIS BLEU (Hsiung/Liu)

Again needs time to mature and develop, but she has a pretty head and the muzzle needs to fill in. Today looks a little high on leg and the body at this stage is almost square. Moved well.

2. NIGHTINGALE FIREBALL – (Mulligan)

The baby of the bunch. So cute and loved the confidence. Head needs time. Ears are a little bit low set at the moment, which makes the skull look very round. Leg could have a bit more height. The bite still needs to settle. She is very young and has lots of time.

SENIOR PUPPY BITCH (4)

1. CHADWICK SECRET CODE (Eckersley)

Excellent breed type. Will be very smart when she matures. Beautiful head. Soft expression. Correct height of leg. Strong neck. Lovely coat and well broken markings. Back could be shorter. I predict a very good future. Well deserved winner of <u>BEST</u> **PUPPY BITCH**.

- ORCHARDHILL TRIED AND TRUE (Venier/Venier) Very smart tricolour. Really nice head and will have a lovely expression when she develops. I would prefer the marking to be better broken. Correct bone. What I did not like is that she falls away in the rear just above the tail.
- FOXWYN CHARMED IM SURE (Baker-Fox)
 Still needs time to develop in all areas. I found the muzzle to be a little long, which affects the expression. Leg has too much height and I did not like the topline. Moved ok.

4. SHERAH BEST DRESSED – (Crommett)

A pretty little lady but needs to build on confidence. Unfortunately kept the head down all the time which made the topline look incorrect. Would have liked more height of leg to balance the outline.

GRADUATE PUPPY BITCH (3)

1. LINRICA ROSE PETALS – (Liu)

Liked her shape and size. Very feminine with excellent proportions. Nice eyes and head of correct shape. In top condition with strong body and very nice coat. Strong movement in both front and hind action. My only criticism is that she falls away slightly at the croup. I predict a very good future.

2. CHADWICK TATTLETELLER TALES – (Eckersley)

Some very nice qualities. Excellent body. Correct bone. Held the topline well on the move. Very rich colour. Strong neck. At the moment, the head just looks too small for the body. Still has plenty of time to mature.

 MARJORELLE RUMOUR HAS IT – (Conley) Excellent temperament and coat was very well presented. Body had great substance, and she had nice dark round eyes. However, I did feel that the body looked too square in outline. Ears were too low set and the bite was undershot.

NOVICE BITCH (3)

- BONITOS COMPANEROS JOSEPHINE OF WELMFORTH (Lasser)
 This is a very pretty bitch. Excellent size with correct height of leg and length of back.
 Nicely balanced head of correct proportions and a very soft expression. Correct bone.
 Moved well in front action. Hind action could be stronger. Just lacking in body today.
- 2. AVIA CORAL (Poti/Poti)

Beautifully presented Ruby with a very pretty soft expression. Lovely texture of coat and a body of great substance. For me I want stronger bones and a larger head. Unfortunately the topline was roached on the move and more like that of a King Charles Spaniel.

 CARLEN AMBER MARSALA SPICE – (Close) For me, she was just too big and masculine in type. The muzzle is too long which affects the expression. Leg is too high and the back too long. Excellent coat. Strong topline. Moved very well.

BRED BY EXHIBITOR BITCH (1)

1. LINRICA KISSED BY AN ANGEL – (Hsiung/Liu)

I liked her more on the stand. Excellent shape. Body of good balance. Nice shape and size of head and a gentle soft expression. Out of coat at the moment. What I did not like was that the neck was a little short. The topline could be stronger on the move and the hind action was weak.

JUNIOR AMERICAN BRED BITCH (2)

1. DIORCHAVON P S I LOVE YOU – (Bialek)

I liked the head very much, but unfortunately she was undershot. However it did not affect the expression. She was sound in movement and had excellent reach of neck. For me, also, the leg had too much height.

2. CHADWICK OH LA LA (Greak/Comer/Eckersley)

Pretty Cavalier and soft expression, but like quite a few of the females today, I found the head just a little too small for the body. I would like more width between the ears, and muzzle could be stronger. I found in the hind action that she waddled and was too wide.

AMERICAN BRED BITCH (6)

 VALENTYNE PILLOW TALK – (O'Brien) Solid bitch. Lovely mover. Strong head of correct shape and size and a lovely expression. Heavy marking, but strong rich chestnut colour. Excellent topline. Back could be slightly shorter. Excellent reach in front and great drive from behind.

KELLENE COPACABANA – (Marshall) Solid brood bitch type. Not the glamorous show type, but some very nice qualities. Excellent pigmentation. Strong movement and a lovely temperament. Carrying a little weight.

3. **PIAFFE IN THE TULIPS** – (Rychlik)

Very nice shape with a lovely head of correct size and soft expression. Beautiful coat and very well presented. On the walk around, she could have been my winner, but unfortunately when she was on the table, I did not like the feet. Hare like.

4. **KISSABELLA ARABELLA** – (Bronowicka/Carter)

Like the shape and size. Good length of back and strong topline on the move. Lovely coat and well presented. What I did not like was that the muzzle, for me, was too long and neck was lacking. Very strong movement in front and hind action.

HEALTH AND CONFORMATION BITCH (1)

1. CLOPSVILLE SANTA ANA – (Rychlik)

Wonderful temperament and very happy to be in the ring. Very feminine. Nice shape, but the back could be a bit shorter to balance the outline. Strong topline on the move. I would have liked the neck to be stronger. Head was nice, but muzzle just needs a little more length.

Excellent tail carriage. Elbows could be tighter.

SPECIAL LIMIT BLENHEIM BITCH (4)

"I found this class disappointing compared to how strong the male Special Limit Blenheim Class

was."

1. LINRICA MIGNON MOCHI, JW – (Liu)

Very much out of coat at the moment, but this showed off even better her beautiful shape and strong solid topline. Very good reach of neck.

I would have liked the bone to be stronger and a larger head for the body. But she had a very pretty expression. Very sound in movement.

2. **ORCHARDHILL EPHEMERAL** – (Venier/Venier)

I loved her head and expression. In fact, she had the best head in this class. I just found her to be a little too high on leg and the front action could be stronger. Excellent neck. Good bone and body of substance.

3. CHANTISMERE CARRIEANNA – (Tibbetts)

In top condition with a great body, beautiful coat with deep chestnut colour. Excellent outline with a strong neck and strong movement in both front and hind action. What I did not like was the fact she sits down too much on her feet and the head for me was not strong enough.

Needed more width between the ears and also more width of muzzle.

4. **KISSABELLA BIANCA** – (Bronowicka/Carter)

Very feminine smaller type of female. Lovely temperament. In excellent condition, but too short on leg and tail carriage could be better. Topline could also be stronger. Neck was too short.

<u>SPECIAL LIMIT TRICOLOR BITCH</u> (1)

1. **KELLENE LADY OF THE LAKE** – (Marshall) Lovely temperament. Solid honest type of female. Coat had too much curl. Heavily marked and a bit masculine in type. The shape was good and head honest. Strong neck and good topline.

SPECIAL LIMIT RUBY BITCH (2)

- INFINIDAD CHOCOLATE BOX (Laliberte, VND) Very feminine. Beautiful shape. Really strong topline on the move. Correct bone. Pretty head and a nice soft expression. From a colour perspective, I would have liked it to be richer. The eyes were too prominent and she was also undershot. As it did not effect the expression, she won the class. *BEST RUBY BITCH*.
- HARANA CYNDI LAUPER AT TARRYON (Burnham/Steele) Nice rich colour. Excellent coat. Correct bite. Nice eyes. Good length of back. Unfortunately, I did not like the topline. She also fell away at the croup. Elbows could be tighter. Head was ok, but could be stronger. Nice temperament.

SPECIAL LIMIT BLACK-AND-TAN BITCH (2)

1. HARANA NENEH CHERRY – (Gentil)

Very strong topline. Correct bone. Coat of excellent quality and texture. Pretty head and nice expression, but I would have liked a larger head for the body. Nice eyes.

2. CARLEN FIRST PICT SANGIOVESE – (Close)

For me, masculine in type. Out of coat today. Too high on leg and long on back. Moved ok. Topline could be stronger. I did prefer her expression to the winner. Lovely eyes.

<u>OPEN BITCH</u> (4)

"Gone to Judge's heaven again. On the walk around, some beautiful Cavaliers I could not wait to get my hands on. The very best kept until now."

1. CH TASSAJARA FORESTCREEK CRISTAL – (Cline)

OMG. What a beautiful head and a very gentle soft expression. On the stand, the body and shape just said balance. Perfect height of leg and length of back. Wonderful typical Cavalier temperament that just said "Pick Me." The tail never stopping wagging. Excellent pigmentation and dark eyes. In top condition. my only criticism is front action could be stronger. Well deserved winner of <u>BEST IN SHOW. WINNERS BITCH.</u> <u>BEST AMERICAN BRED IN SHOW. BEST AMERICAN BRED BITCH. BEST BLENHEIM IN SHOW. BEST BLENHEIM BITCH.</u>

2. CH ORCHARDHILL GIRL TALK – (Venier/Venier)

Top quality female and excellent breed type. Again, a head and expression to die for. So soft and gentle. Beautiful coat of exceptional quality and texture. Very sound in movement in both front and hind action. Lovely eyes and great neck. Compared to the winner she just looked a little masculine, but I'm only picking hairs. The decision between the two was very close. Well deserved winner of <u>RESERVE WINNERS</u> <u>BITCH</u>.

- **3.** CH FOXWYN A LIKELY STORY (Baker-Fox/Greak/Comer) Very pretty lady. Nice head of correct shape and nice expression. Good bone and correct length of back. Sound in movement. Nice rich colour. Neck, for me, could be stronger and on occasions carried the tail a little high.
- 4. CH ILOO DITE ILAN DU JARDIN DE CLAIRE OF SUMARA, JW (Gentil) Pretty female, but I would like more size. She had a good body and coat of nice quality. Good expression. Hind action could be stronger. Body was nicely balanced in outline.

SENIOR OPEN BITCH (1)

CH PRIMA QUARTETT BLOODY MARY – (Bronowicka/Carter)

 year old Tri female in beautiful condition. A credit to the owner. Very strong
 movement with excellent shoulders and great drive behind. Very strong topline on the
 move. Nicely balanced head. Neck could be slightly stronger, but overall excellent
 Breed type. Well deserved winner of <u>BEST TRI-COLOUR IN SHOW</u>, <u>BEST TRI-COLOUR BITCH</u>

VETERAN DOG (2)

"So hard to judge this class. Both in Super Condition and a total credit to the owners."

1. CH NIGHTINGALE HEAT WAVE, JW (Mulligan)

This young man is nearly 10 years of age and still has that extra sparkle and showmanship. How could I not award him Best Veteran In Show. Moved around the ring today with such confidence. So happy to be here and could show some of the younger one's how to move. Lovely shape and super expression. Well deserved winner of **BEST VETERAN IN SHOW**.

2. HOMERBRENT EARL

Over 13 years in age and still a star. His owners should be very proud to have him in this condition at this age. Still got the moves and super temperament. Thank you for bringing him to the show.

BRACE (1)

1. **AVIA CAMELLIA and AVIA LOGO** (Poti/Poti) Very similar pair of Black-and-Tan Cavaliers. They were like peas in a pod, and difficult to tell apart. Similar shape. Very similar style head. Happy together and were a pair moving around the ring. A lovely Brace.
