Brief biographies of our guest lecturers follows:

Dawna Voelkl was born and raised in Emsworth, Pennsylvania and earned her undergraduate degree from Bryn Mawr College in 1991. After completing her post-baccalaureate pre-health courses at the University of Pennsylvania, Dr. Voelkl received her veterinary degree (DVM) from Cornell University in 2003. She then completed the first year of a residency in comparative theriogenology (reproduction) at the University of Minnesota and the final two years at the New Bolton Center of the University of Pennsylvania. At the conclusion of her residency training, Dr. Voelkl achieved specialty board certification from the American College of Theriogenologists in 2006. From Penn, Dr. Voelkl joined the faculty of the College of Veterinary Medicine in Missouri and served as Assistant and then Associate Teaching Professor of Theriogenology, until she joined the practice of Meadowlands Veterinary Hospital in 2022.

Dietrich Volkmann grew up on a beef ranch in Namibia and was educated at the University of Pretoria in South Africa, where he worked until 2000. His most recent post was as head of the Department of Theriogenology. In South Africa, veterinarians must learn about all species, so Volkmann conducted research across many veterinary species, including dogs and sheep. Volkmann, who joined the college faculty in Missouri in 2006? He has published numerous scientific research studies and a textbook on Reproductive Veterinary Ultrasonography.





Junior Puppy Dog (1)

1) Enzo (Elsa)

Sweet, happy boy, just 5 months old. Very dark coat pigment and eyes. Pleasing expression but could use a bit more fill to complete that typical cavalier look. Still very slim (mom says he's not a great eater) and will hopefully get more substance as he matures. Moved happily and confidently around the ring with reach and drive.

Reserve Best in Match, Winners Dog, Best Puppy in Match

SL Exhibit Dog (3)

1) Ch Bella Sogni Dolce De Amor, VW (Weeks/Weeks)

Lovely well broken tri boy, correct proportions, dark eyes and my notes say "Can't believe he's 10 years old!!". Good angulation front and rear, with a level topline and tail flowing correctly off his back. Moved like a true spaniel, just a joy to watch going around the ring. Having judged him in the past, I must say he has only improved with age!

Best SL Exhibit in Match

2) Falling Springs Black Flame at Madryn (Weeks/Weeks)

Beautiful B&T boy, love his head/expression and overall shape. Good angulation, balanced with reach and drive. Silky, straight coat and good bone. I was told afterwards he was in this class because he already has major points, which was no surprise and I'm sure he'll be made up a Ch in no time.

3) Ch Nightingale Heart of Gold (Weeks/Weeks)

Very handsome blenheim boy with large, melting eyes and rich chestnut coat color. Very happy to be showing, but maybe a bit too much which spoiled his topline at times with his antics. I just preferred the shape/outline of #1 today.

Junior Puppy Bitch (1)

1) Falling Springs Take a Chance On Me (Weeks/Weeks)

Sweet puppy who was unsure of herself but did improve near the end. Straight, silky coat but pigment could be richer/darker. Large, dark round eyes, but head type a bit more extreme than I prefer. Had she shown herself to what I believe is her full potential, she might have traded places with the puppy winner.

Senior Puppy Bitch (1)

1) Dolce (Elsa)

Blanketed blenheim puppy with the darkest chestnut pigment. Large dark eyes that produce that melting expression. A bit up on leg, but at 11 months, she's at that stage we often start to question how they will ultimately turn out.

Best Puppy Bitch

Bred By Exhibitor Bitch (1)

1) Madryn Country Roads, C-TKN (Weeks/Weeks)

Lovely well broken blenheim girl with large dark eyes giving her a sweet expression. Silky coat with dark pigment. Good angulation, with strong movement coming and going, level topline and correct tail set. Another one with breed type and could trade places with the winner on another day. Reserve Best in Match Sp Limit Blenhiem Bitch (1)

1) Brookhaven Azura's Star at Madryn (Weeks/Weeks)

Pretty head on this blenheim girl with dark, round eyes. Slightly out of shape (recently off a litter of pups) and carrying a bit of extra weight that didn't do her any favors. Nice shape and substance, would like a bit more turn of stifle to give her more flowing movement.

Sp Limit Tricolor (1)

1) Nightingale The Farmer's Daughter at Madryn (Weeks/Weeks)

Love this well broken tri-color girl who was so happy to be showing today. Feminine with a melting expression. Love her shape and size, nothing overdone or extreme about her; she just exudes breed type. Silky straight coat, good angulation front and rear, with plenty of reach and drive. Dead level topline and tail flowing straight off her back. Not surprised to find she is sired by my SL Exhibit winner.

Best in Match, Winners Bitch

Sp Limit Ruby (1)

1) Bitterroot Penny Lane (Jillian)

Up to size girl with rich, deep ruby coat and large dark eyes giving her a soft, pleasing expression that is so hard to achieve in a ruby. While she was larger in size, she had correct proportions and substance. Good topline and tail set, but would prefer more turn of stifle that would help her rear movement.

Sp Limit Ruby (1)

1) Bitterroot Penny Lane (Jillian)

Up to size girl with rich, deep ruby coat and large dark eyes giving her a soft, pleasing expression that is so hard to achieve in a ruby. While she was larger in size, she had correct proportions and substance. Good topline and tail set, but would prefer more turn of stifle that would help her rear movement. PeeWee Puppy

1) Madryn Shot Through The Heart (Weeks, Weeks)

Adorable well broken blenheim puppy complete with lozenge and having a grand time owning the ring today. Nice topline and tail set, love his shape and outline that is accentuated by his rich chestnut pigment. Very tough decision between the two peewee pups as they both had such redeeming qualities. 2) Madryn Tear in My Heart (Weeks, Weeks)

Another adorable blenheim puppy with dark eyes and sweet expression. Good angulation with strong movement coming and going. Slightly better rear than puppy #1, but a bit longer in the loin. On another day, with a bit more practice, I'm betting these two might trade places. I can see why the breeder is keeping both littermates

UPDATE FROM CKCSC-USA HEALTH & EDUCATION COMMITTEE

Recently you may have read that the Norwegian courts ruled in favor of banning the breeding of Cavalier King Charles Spaniels and Bulldogs due their erroneous belief that ALL dogs from these two breeds are unhealthy and therefore, according to their Animal Welfare Laws, they cannot be bred. On appeal, Bulldogs are now accepted for breeding — Cavaliers are not. Clearly, the Bulldog people have had a cohesive strategy and funding to accomplish this. CKCSC-USA has revitalized our Health and Education Committee to address this very issue. Many other countries and some states in the US are also introducing legislation that would seriously impede the efforts of responsible, preservation breeders. We are hoping to join forces in the near future with the ACKCSC Health & Education Committee to further scientifically explore the effectiveness of health testing in our breeding protocol.

For over 60 years, CKCSC has always been committed to responsible breeding practices which improve breed health and characteristics. The assumption that Cavaliers and Bulldogs are all inherently unhealthy is both

biased and flawed, therefore we hope to work with a respected and experienced epidemiologist to create and administer a survey and ultimately interpret the data collected so that we can be sure that our breeding recommendations are on the right track and learn where there might be room for improvement. The survey will be directed to a broad base of respondents - we will also survey pet owners who obtained their Cavaliers from reputable breeders as well as other sources along with preservation breeders. We have a very involved committee and have been meeting now for several months planning, developing and refining our efforts.
